


The DNR is going to present on Crooked Lake;s success story at a Michigan Regional Conference this year.


The clarity change is due to the 2 year drought. Last year Crooked Lake received an A in clarity for the first time, but now a B, but only missing B+ by 0.15in of clarity.

Lake level is entirely due to/correlated to ground water, we are in 2^{nd} year of a 2 year drought.

Lily pads are controllable only for navigation.

CLAA and partners have been successful at controlling invasive plants while protecting habitat and water quality – yay!
